Last month, we dedicated our brand-new Gold Star Families Memorial. It turned out amazing. I want to thank our Gold Star committee and donors including Steve Rosenvall, Ryan Button, Paul Swenson, and many others that made it possible. The monument is part of a national movement driven by the Woody Williams Foundation, honoring the families who have lost a loved one in service to our great nation. These families feel the ultimate sacrifice every day and remind us that freedom is not free. If you have not seen the monument, take a stroll at Draper Park and take it in. It will move you. The monument is next to the north pavilion and a perfect addition to our park.

Draper Park also has a brand-new parking lot on the south end that allows greater access to the park, and improved parking for events and activities.

Recently, we joined with Lehi
City and created a conservation
easement between the two cities.
Lehi has been a fantastic partner in
working to make Corner Canyon and
Traverse Mountain one giant open

space playground. Mayor Mark Johnson and the Lehi City Council have the vision and we created a conservation easement where Draper City holds their land, which



consists of 900 new acres held in conservation. It is an amazing and creative way to protect land. We have joined Corner Canyon and Traverse Mountain in a way that will benefit our communities for generations. It is exciting.

In a few weeks, Draper Days will begin. We have the new Farmers Market and Food Truck Night beginning the first Tuesday in July at Smith Fields Park.

We kick off Draper Days with a three-night rodeo July 11-13. We then start the fun-filled week with the Horse Pull, Historic Walking Tour, Heritage Banquet, Children's Bike Parade, Draper Idol, Amphitheater Movie Night, Car Show, 5K, and recreation tournaments. Last year we had almost 40,000 people come to the park between Friday and Saturday night. I expect this year will be the

same. Our staff is hard at work to bring you another quality event.

Park activities begin at Draper Park July 18 with the car show and children's bike parade. Friday evening we begin with some local bands, the winner of Draper Idol, and then the Party Crashers led by Jenny Jordan Frogley, a former Draper resident. Her band will rock the night. Jenny is an amazing performer, and it will be fun.

Saturday, we start with Savannah Keyes, a local talent who is now a Nashville performer. She will open up for our headliner, Joe Nichols, a popular country star with 6 #1 singles and 10 Top Ten hits. It will be a great mix of music and activities everyone can enjoy.

Life is good in Draper City. We have a fantastic city staff and great city council. Say hello to a police officer, firefighter, garbage truck driver, parks worker or staff member when you see them. Thank them for their work and dedication to our community. We have good people working for us!

From the red-brick Victorians lining Fort Street to the charming New England Saltbox on 12400 South, Draper is sprinkled with time capsules whispering tales of its history. Working with the city, they meticulously protect Draper's dwindling historic

treasures. Their dedication has paid off — over 16 buildings now grace the National Historic Register! Many of these preserved structures come alive through walking tours and video explorations on the city's website.

Draper's commitment to its past ensures its future. These historic buildings are the foundation of the city's unique character, bridging generations, reminding us of our heritage, and standing as testaments to Draper's enduring spirit. Historic preservation goes beyond sentimentality – it's surprisingly eco-friendly. Built to last, these structures require less energy than constant demolition and reconstruction, making them champions of sustainability. Next time you see a historic building, remember: it's not just brick and mortar, it's a vital piece of Draper's story.





The Point of the Mountain State Land Authority (Land Authority) voted unanimously to advance an application designating the Chapel by the Wayside as a national historic site. The Land Authority has worked with the Utah State Historical Society, the Utah State Historic Preservation Office, Preservation Utah, Draper Historical Society, and other key stakeholders to solicit input regarding chapel preservation.

Built by prisoners after residents and religious and civic groups raised money, the chapel stands as a beacon of hope and symbol of redemption as the site transforms into Utah's innovation Community.

The Land Authority is working closely with interested stakeholders to submit a

nomination to be reviewed by the Board of State History. If approved, the nomination is submitted to the National Park Service for final determination. The process is anticipated to take several months.
